Wolf goes to First Pig's house, blows it down, & eats the pig	First Pig is too scared or too smart to open the door for the wolf. Wolf doesn't mean to kill the pig with his sneeze, but since the pig's dead he thinks it's okay to eat him. He still needs sugar.
Wolf goes to Second Pig's house, blows it down, & eats the pig	Second Pig may be too scared or too smart or just too busy to open the door for the wolf. Wolf doesn't mean to kill this pig either, but again thinks it's okay to eat him. He still needs sugar.
Wolf goes to Third Pig's house and tries (but fails) to blow it down	Third Pig feels annoyed by the wolf and safe in his house. Wolf feels so mad when the pig insults his granny that he tries to break down the door.
